2. Notes

- Dr. Mensah initiated meeting.

- The floor was open for discussion on various topics, summarized below.
- Key stakeholders we are missing:
 - Critical that LA DOTD is involved (Jody Colvin or representative); also, make it easy for LA DOTD to attend meetings, by holding meetings at their Training Center (perhaps, at lunch for "Lunch-n-Learns")
 - Should involve other LA MPOs, including the New Orleans, Alexandria (Matt Johns), and Shreveport (Chris Petro) MPOs
 - o FHWA John Broemmelsiek
- Defining our mission and goals:
 - The national/international mission and goals of SimCap are very applicable to the LA SimCap (and could be adopted)
- Defining our purpose and objectives:
 - Increasing awareness of LA DOTD initiatives, national activities and guidance, and the latest SimCap tools
 - o Increasing communication of LA DOTD updates and activities to stakeholders
 - Providing a forum for sharing SimCap experiences (across organizations) and receiving feedback/answers to questions
 - Providing educational opportunities to learn of more appropriate and efficient ways of conducting SimCap analysis (e.g., education on mesoscopic modeling, etc.)
 - Additionally, become mechanism to request education/training (e.g., from FHWA's Resource Center)
 - o Help address any important and emerging needs in LA (e.g. Freight Rerouting)
- Scheduling next meeting:
 - o Aim for quarterly meetings, then eventually monthly meetings
 - Have mixture of webinar and in-person meetings (with in-person meetings having a webinar option)

- Can solicit topics through survey or the sharing/help forum
- o Future webinar can feature other SimCap groups discussing their mission/goals, structure, events, etc.
- Carlos McCloud (FHWA) volunteered Pong Wu (CRPC) to develop a presentation on some models he has developed to share at next meeting

- Joey Lefante or Chris Melson will do a brief presentation about SimCap Louisiana at the DSITE Meeting to be held in New Orleans 3/8/2018 (Lefante, Melson)
- Continue outreach at related local events/meetings (everyone)
